The Strategic Plan builds on Canterbury Museum's rich history. In 2017 we celebrated 150 years since Sir Julius von Haast founded the Museum and 2020 marked our 150th anniversary on the Rolleston Avenue site in central Ōtautahi Christchurch.

Canterbury Museum acquires and cares for worldwide collections of human and natural history, with a focus on the Ngāi Tahu rohe, Waitaha Canterbury and the Antarctic. Access to these collections drives research, inspires learning and ignites imagination through programmes, stories and exhibitions that inform and delight our visitors.

This plan sets out our priorities for the next 5 years and guides and informs the Museum's annual work plans. The key strategic priority which underpins all our actions is:

• The Museum Redevelopment Project to upgrade our buildings and the visitor experience.

The redevelopment project informs and is supported by three other priorities:

- Effective community, national and global engagement
- Access to a rich body of collections and research
- Provision of a sustainable, healthy and well-resourced Museum environment.

Specific performance measures have been identified for each of these priorities which will be reviewed and set out in the Museum's Annual Plan. The Strategic Plan will be subject to an interim review in the planning year 2024/25.

Our goal

By 2027, we will have completed the Museum redevelopment to save, restore and protect vital parts of the current Museum, and design and deliver inspirational stories through a new visitor experience. The newly developed Museum will reflect our history and heritage, and our vision and aspiration to be a world-class facility capable of hosting major international exhibitions, providing education and public programmes, sharing our treasures and celebrating all that makes Waitaha Canterbury and Aotearoa New Zealand great. The new Museum will reinforce our service to our people, Te Tiriti, our local and regional visitors and communities, and national and international visitors for the next 100 years.

- Focus on delivering a major new visitor experience for Ōtautahi Christchurch, Waitaha Canterbury, Aotearoa New Zealand and the world
- Enable better access to our buildings and facilities

- Engage actively with stakeholders, businesses and communities to ensure ongoing public support
- Seek to ensure that we secure sufficient funding and consents to fully realise the redevelopment
- In the planning year 2022/23, plan for and pack the entire contents of the Museum and decant to other buildings
- In the planning years 2023/4 to 2025/26 while we are out of our building carry out four major projects:
 - * Establish temporary/pop up exhibitions to maintain visitor and community links
 - Undertake further work towards the development of a full inventory of our collections on the Vernon database and improve online access
 - * Plan and create new exhibitions and experiences for the redeveloped Museum
 - * Maximise the use of digital technology across all activities
- In the planning year 2026/27, move back into the building and set up and open new visitor experiences.
